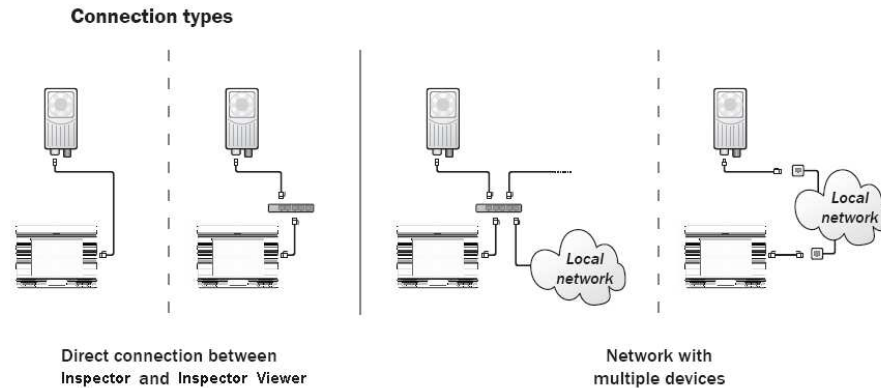
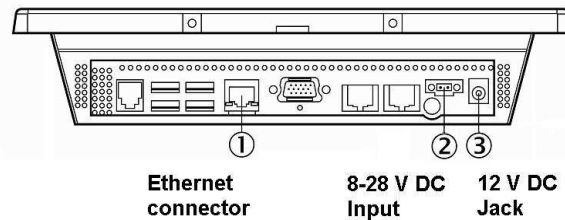


Inspector Viewer - Quick Start



1 Installation of the Inspector and Inspector Viewer hardware

- Connect the Ethernet connector on the Inspector to a network, or directly to an Ethernet connector on the Inspector Viewer hardware.
- In case Inspector is not connected directly to the Inspector Viewer, connect the Ethernet cable on the Inspector Viewer hardware to the same network as Inspector.
- Connect the Inspector to a 24 V DC power supply.
- Connect the Inspector Viewer hardware directly to 8-28V DC power supply or use the 12 V DC adapter shipped with the hardware.

2 Getting started

2.1 Powering up

Press 'Power' button on the Inspector Viewer hardware. After the boot up session (takes about 30 seconds) the Menu screen is shown and a default user is logged in. The default user has all user rights.

2.2 Switch to another language

- Press button 'Other Settings' on the Menu.
- Select the desired language from the displayed list.
- Press button 'Save'.
- Press the 'Menu' button on the Language screen.

2.3 Connect to Inspector

- Press button 'Network' on the Menu.
- Set the network settings of the Viewer and the Inspector.
 - It is recommended to use the auto-configuration function. Press button 'AUTOCONFIG' on the Network screen.



Previous Inspector network settings may be changed using the auto-configuration function!

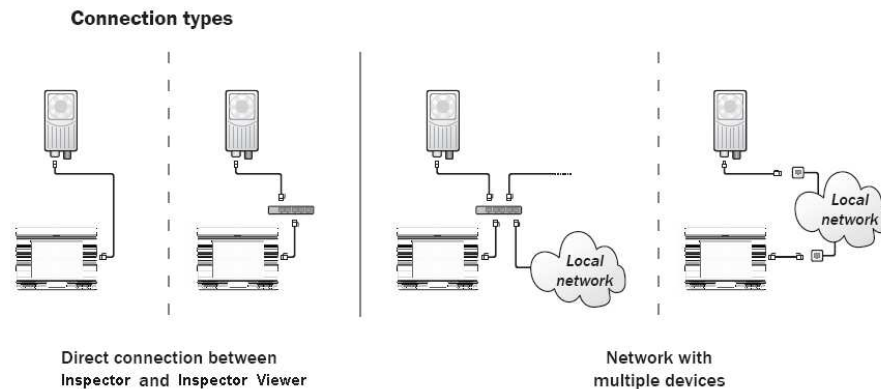
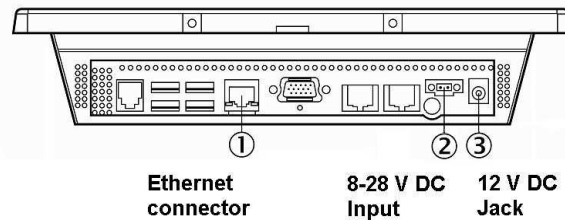
- Adjust the network settings manually.
- Press button 'Menu' on the Network screen.
- Press button 'Select Inspector' on the Menu.
- Select the Inspector you want to connect to.
- Press button 'Connect'.
- Inspector Viewer Application connects to Inspector.
- Live view is displayed.

1 Installation der Inspector- und Inspector Viewer-Hardware

- Verbinden Sie den Ethernet-Anschluss des Inspectors mit einem Netzwerk oder direkt mit einem Ethernet-Anschluss an der Inspector Viewer-Hardware.
- Falls Inspector nicht direkt mit dem Inspector Viewer verbunden ist, schließen Sie das Ethernet-Kabel an der Inspector Viewer-Hardware an dasselbe Netzwerk an, mit dem auch Inspector verbunden ist.
- Schließen Sie den Inspector an eine 24-V-Spannungsversorgung an.
- Schließen Sie die Inspector Viewer-Hardware direkt an eine 8-28V Spannungsversorgung an, oder verwenden Sie den mit der Hardware gelieferten 12V Adapter.

2 Erste Schritte

2.1 Einschalten

Drücken Sie die Einschalttaste an der Inspector Viewer-Hardware. Nach dem Hochfahren (dies nimmt ca. 30 Sekunden in Anspruch) wird der Menü-Bildschirm angezeigt, und ein Standardbenutzer wird angemeldet. Der Standardbenutzer verfügt über alle Benutzerrechte.

2.2 Wechseln der Sprache

- Drücken Sie im Menü auf die Schaltfläche 'Weitere Einstellungen'.
- Wählen Sie die gewünschte Sprache aus der angezeigten Liste.
- Drücken Sie 'Speichern'.

2.3 Verfahren zur Verbindungsherstellung mit Inspector:

- Drücken Sie im Menü auf 'Netzwerk'.
- Legen Sie die Netzwerkeinstellungen für Viewer und Inspector fest.
 - Dazu sollten Sie die Autokonfigurationsfunktion verwenden. Drücken Sie im Bildschirm 'Netzwerk' auf die Schaltfläche 'AUTOKONFIG'.



Vorherige Inspector-Netzwerkeinstellungen können bei Verwendung der Autokonfigurationsfunktion geändert werden.

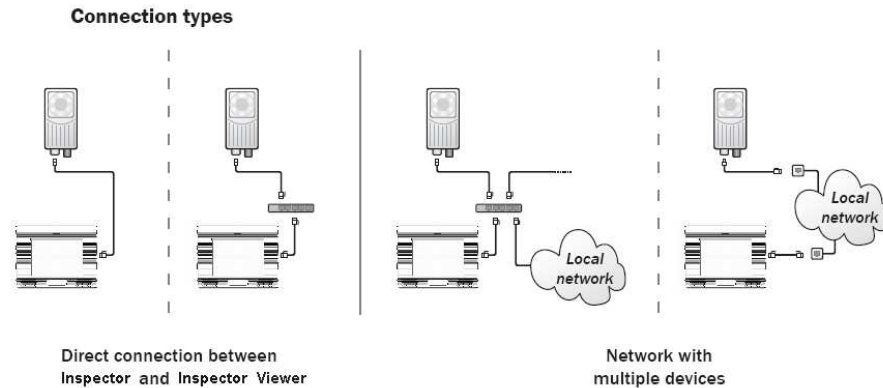
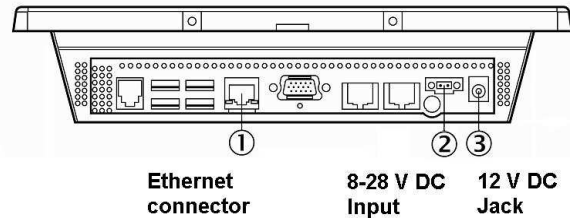
- Passen Sie die Netzwerkeinstellungen manuell an.

1 Instalación del hardware de Inspector e Inspector Viewer

- Conecte el conector Ethernet del Inspector a una red o, directamente, al conector Ethernet del hardware de Inspector Viewer.
- Si el Inspector no se conecta directamente a Inspector Viewer, conecte el cable Ethernet del hardware de Inspector Viewer a la misma red que el Inspector.

2 Inicio

2.1 Encendido

Pulse el botón 'Power' del hardware de Inspector Viewer. Tras la sesión de arranque (unos 30 segundos), se muestra la pantalla Menú y accede un usuario predeterminado. El usuario predeterminado tiene todos los derechos de usuario.

2.2 Cambiar a otro idioma

- Pulse el botón 'Otros ajustes' en el menú.
- Seleccione el idioma deseado en la lista que se muestra.
- Pulse el botón 'Guardar'.

2.3 Procedimiento de conexión a Inspector:

- Pulse el botón 'Red' en el menú.
- Defina los ajustes de red de Viewer e Inspector.
 - Se recomienda utilizar la función de configuración automática. Pulse el botón 'CONFIGURACIÓN AUTOMICA' de la pantalla Red.

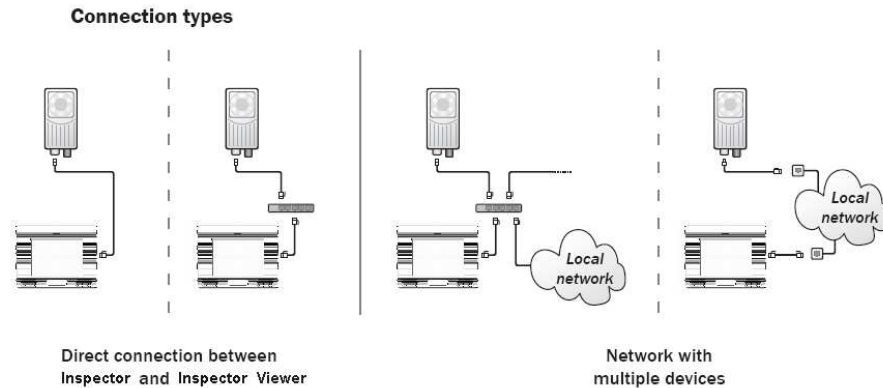
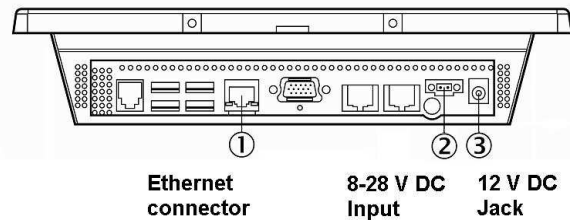

1 Installation de l'Inspector et du dispositif Inspector Viewer

2 Démarrage

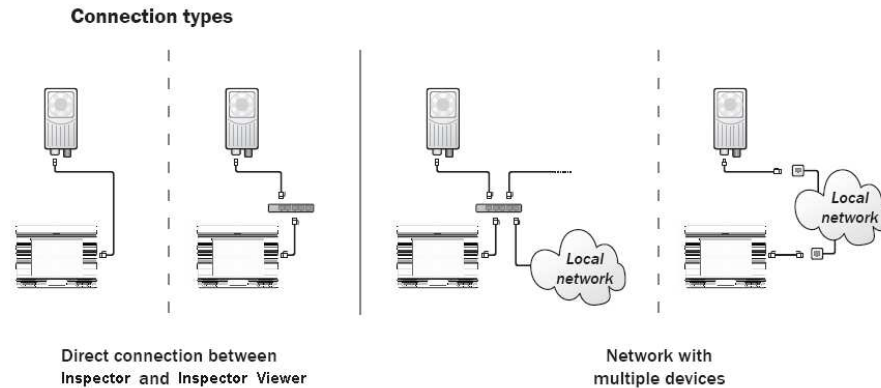
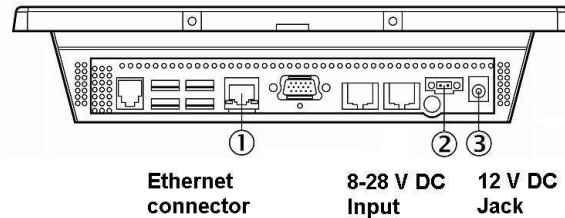

2 Come iniziare

2.1 Accensione

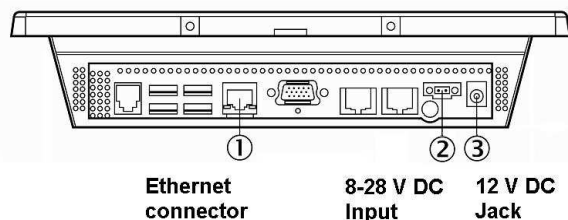

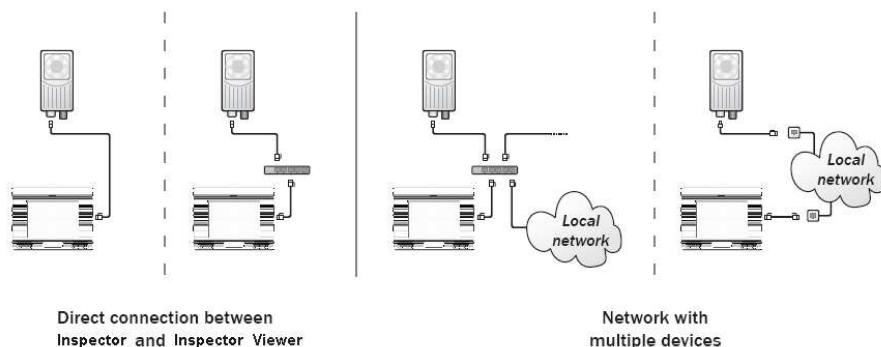

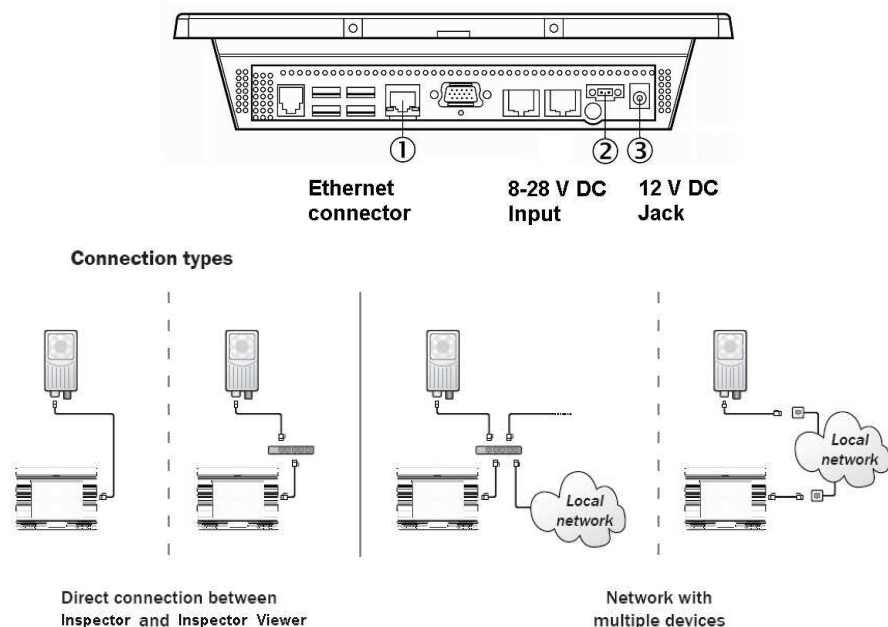
